Release of 2025 Singapore Cambridge GCE N-Level Examination Results

- MOE has announced that the GCE N-Level Examination results will be released on Thursday,
 18 December 2025 at 2.00 pm.
- 2. Your child/ward must be in full school uniform and proper appearance in line with the school's code of conduct (e.g. no dyed hair etc) when reporting to school to collect their results.

- 4. Students who are unable to collect their results in person should inform their form teacher and can appoint a proxy to collect a physical copy of their results on their behalf. Proxies are required to produce (a) Proxy's IC and (b) Proxy letter for the school's verification that is attached in the accompanying Parent Gateway announcement when collecting the results at the school's General Office. Results can be collected in the Multi-Purpose Hall from 2.30 pm on 18 December or at the General Office starting 19 December.
- 5. Parents or guardians accompanying their child or ward will need to fill in the Visitor Registration Form before visiting the school.

Parents or guardians accompanying their child or ward must register at the security post and wear a visitor tag for easy identification. The tag must be put on at all times while in school.

6. Students should only alight/be picked up at designated venues in the school. Like many other driveways, our school's driveway is designed for passenger pick-up and drop off only. Any parking along the driveway not designed for that purpose poses a serious safety concern for students and staff. Hence, parking or waiting is strictly not allowed in the school's driveway.

7. Application for Institute of Technical Education (ITE) courses

- Candidates who wish to apply for courses offered by ITE can submit their applications online via the ITE application portal (www.ite.edu.sg/apply-for-ITE-courses), between 2.30pm on 18 December 2025, Thursday and 5pm on 22 December 2025, Monday. Hard copy application forms will also be available at the Customer & Visitor Centres at the three ITE Colleges. Applicants who wish to collect hard copy application forms from the Customer & Visitor Centres should first book an appointment by contacting the respective colleges via the email addresses or phone numbers provided at www.ite.edu.sg/who-we-are/get-in-touch.
- The ITE posting results will be released at 9am on 26 December 2025, Friday. Candidates may check the posting results online via the ITE application portal.
- o Candidates who receive an ITE offer should accept or reject the offer via the ITE application portal between 9am on 26 December 2025, Friday and 11.59pm on 2 January 2026, Friday.

8. Application for the Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)

- The Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP) prepares candidates for progression into selected polytechnic diploma courses via a two-year Higher Nitec course at ITE. Under the DPP, candidates who successfully complete their Higher Nitec course and attain the required minimum qualifying Higher Nitec Grade Point Average are guaranteed a place in a polytechnic diploma course mapped to their Higher Nitec course. School candidates eligible for the DPP will receive a copy of Form N from their secondary schools, inviting them to apply for the DPP.
- Applications for the DPP can be submitted online via the ITE application portal between 2.30pm on 18 December 2025, Thursday and 5pm on 22 December 2025, Monday.
- The DPP posting results will be released at 2pm on 26 December 2025, Friday. Candidates may check the posting results online via the ITE application portal.
- o Candidates who receive a DPP offer should accept or reject the offer via the ITE application portal between 2pm on 26 December 2025, Friday and 11.59pm on 2 January 2026, Friday.
- School candidates who do not have a confirmed place in the DPP should report to their secondary schools in 2026 for Secondary 5.

9. Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP)

- The Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP) is a diploma foundation programme conducted over two academic semesters at the polytechnics by polytechnic lecturers. It caters to school candidates in the Secondary 4 N(A) course in 2025 who have decided to pursue a polytechnic education and meet the PFP eligibility requirements at the end of Secondary 4.
- School candidates interested in applying for the PFP should first report to their secondary schools in 2026 to start their Secondary 5 year, while awaiting notification of eligibility and confirmation of a place in the PFP.
- Applications for the PFP will open in January 2026, on the day of the GCE Ordinary-Level (O-Level) Examinations results release. Candidates eligible for the PFP will receive a copy of Form P on the same day, inviting them to apply for the PFP.
